Event Description

The global financial industry is widely regarded as a key revenue source to fill the financing gap needed to address the climate crisis. This event will critically appraise whether transactions such as climate bonds, green, blue, and sustainability-linked bonds, as well as debt for nature swaps, can effectively address the climate crisis. Speakers will reflect on how these instruments are transforming biodiversity resources such as forests and wildlife habitats into investible assets.

Consistent with Afronomicslaw's 2023 book, <u>Transforming Climate Finance in an Era of Sovereign Debt Distress</u>, Sheria Publishing House (2023), the event will centre on two major types of the impact these climate finance transactions have. *First*, the impact these transactions have on the countries and the people less responsible for the climate crisis. *Second*, how these transactions relate to the historical ecological responsibility of the countries most responsible for the climate crisis.
