On May 2-5, 2023, two of our Editors attended the workshop entitled <u>Trade and Climate Action</u>: Shifting the Paradigm for a Just Transition and Sustainable <u>Development</u> in Bridgetown, Barbados. The Workshop is part of the <u>Remaking Global Trade Project</u> collaboratively convened by the <u>Shridath Ramphal Centre</u> (SRC), <u>Yale Center for Environmental Law and Policy</u>, and <u>The Fletcher School at Tufts University</u>.

"The Remaking Global Trade for a Sustainable Future Project aims to rethink the foundations for international commerce and develop a WTO reform agenda to better position this critical international organization to meet the needs of the current moment and better align the trading system with the world community's commitment to a sustainable future. The Project will map out where the world needs to go over the next decade to address economic inequality, achieve the transition to a clean energy future, and advance other dimensions of the sustainable development vision – and specify what the trading system's role should be in promoting the transformation required."

The Workshop, which is one of ten being hosted world-wide on the trade and sustainability connection, brought together policymakers, academics, regional and international officials, civil society leaders, business and finance executives from the fields of finance, trade, sustainable development, and climate change from around the world.
