Additionally, it is no longer news that Africa is facing severe food insecurity. The <u>Food and Agriculture</u> <u>Organisation of the United Nations</u> (FAO) and the <u>African Union</u> (AU) note that

over 190 million people in Africa are affected by food crises on the continent. While there are socio-economic and political reasons for food insecurity, research reveals that energy crises and climate change are major drivers.
